Evidence Annex Renovation and Remodel

The Linn County Sheriff's Office has the need to renovate and remodel the Evidence Annex building, located at 1050 Jackson Street SE, across from the main Sheriff's Office. This building has historically been split use, between the Sheriff's Office Evidence/Property Storage, and General Services. However, partnerships with General Services have enabled the Sheriff's Office to renovate and make use of the entire building space.

The Invitation to Bid included with this R&O is to complete the desired renovation and remodel work, to meet current International Association of Property and Evidence standards for the handling, storage and care of evidence and property. This project is within our existing approved operating budget.

Detention

Benton: 6 youth were held for 68 total of days of care, 1 females and 5 males.

Total Admissions to Detention = 6

Average Length of Stay = 11.33 days

Average Daily Population = 2.19 youth

Linn: 24 youth were held for 191 total of days of care, 5 females and 19 males.

Total Admissions to Detention = 25

Average Length of Stay = 7.64 days

Average Daily Population = 8.07 youth

Time for Change Program: Program suspended due to COVID

Probation

The Juvenile Department received 43 referrals during the month of July 2019.

Of the 43 referrals, 6 represent dependency, 15 status and 22 criminal.

There are currently 272 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 28 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 89 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 39 youth.

Victim Advocate is serving 106.







Note: Person, Property & Drug Crimes are at the ALLEGATION level.





The Toolcat would replace one of our wheel tractors that was used for mowing and utility work. In addition, the Toolcat will have the ability to be used for snow removal at Clear Lake Resort during the winter months. Replacement of the tractor was included in the Park 2020- 2021 capital equipment budget of the Forest Fund. We will not be using General Fund to purchase this piece of equipment.
