RE: Update on OCWCOG Activities and Programs

Community and Economic Development

- Planning
Staff are providing planning support for the City of Sweet Home, including assisting with counter support, land use applications, and planning commission meetings.
- Census 2020
OCWCOG is organizing and staffing a Census 2020 Complete Count Committee for the Region. Staff will soon be reaching out to all OCWCOG Members to organize the first meeting. OCWCOG Members are encouraged to determine who will represent them on the Committee.

Transportation Services

- Albany Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO)
Staff is preparing for the *Fiscal Year 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)* process.

The AAMPO Technical Advisory Committee and Policy Board have been discussing and updating allocation policies and application materials for Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funding.

The *Strategic Assessment* with the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) and ODOT is on-going. Staff is currently working through a sensitivity testing process.

- Cascades West RideLine (RideLine)
RideLine continues to provide high levels of non-emergent medical transportation assistance. In the period of April - June 2019, 4,152 *RideLine* clients took a total of 54,417 trips. Most of these trips were sedan (32,246) trips or mileage reimbursements (14,294).

Most transportation services are for physical, mental, and dental health, with the single highest concentration of transportation services around alcohol and drug treatment, and mental health. A breakdown of trips made in Linn County is here:

In total, 63,106 individuals are eligible for transportation assistance in OCWOG’s tri-County Region., including 35,075 in Benton County (3,300 Oregon Health Plan (OHP); 30,143 InterCommunity Health Network Coordinated Care Organization clients; plus, other Benton County residents on OHP with another Coordinated Care Organization total 1,632).

- Statewide Transportation Improvement Fund (STIF) Discretionary Grants
The preliminary list of projects for STIF Discretionary funds is now available for public comment. This list is the Oregon Department of Transportation’s (ODOT) staff recommendation to the Public Transportation Advisory Committee (PTAC). The PTAC will make a recommendation to the Oregon Transportation Commission (OTC), which will make the final decision.
 - Two projects that the OCWCOG Community and Economic Development (CED) Department submitted are recommended to be funded. This includes:
 - A 99W Transit Corridor feasibility study, and
 - A project that intends to provide a “Seamless Transit Experience,” across the Linn, Benton, and Lincoln Region.

The Juvenile Department received 74 referrals during the month of June 2019.

There are currently 187 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 57 youth.





JUNE 2019 Statistics







R&O 2019-215

This is Amendment #1 to the Sweet Home Health Center Lease Agreement with Benton County. This amendment changes the Base Rent amount from \$0 to \$2,000 per month for rent and additional \$612 for utilities.

R&O 2019-232

This is an Intergovernmental Agreement between OHSU and Linn County for the Cacoon Program. This is grant funding from OHSU for \$16,416 to provide families with knowledge, skills, and confidence in caring for children with special health needs through home visiting nurses.

R&O 2019-233

This is an intergovernmental agreement for Oregon Health Authority to provide Tort liability coverage to Linn County as a provider of Psychiatric Security Board (PSRB) services.

Park Concessions Contract with Northwest Mobile Cuisine (N'Reener's)

- Linn County Parks is requesting the BOC sign a contract for food concession services at Foster Reservoir with Norene Collins of NW Mobile Cuisine. We only received one proposal, which was Norene Collin's proposal, however, the County Parks Staff believe it is a good proposal and for this first year of providing concessions, having one vendor is adequate.
- We did not receive any protests following the Notice of Intent to award the Food Services Concession Contract.
- The contract includes potentially providing portable food & beverage cart/trailer services at Lewis Creek Park, Edgewater Marina and Sunnyside County Park during the summer months of June, July, and August. The first year we would focus on Lewis Creek where we have received the most visitor requests for food and beverage services.
- The Linn County Parks Commission passed a motion supporting the addition of food and beverage concessions in the parks listed in the RFP. Park visitors have asked for these services at the Parks. The Parks staff believes that provision of food concessions will expand and diversify the services offered to park visitors and provide an additional revenue source to help support the County Parks system, with very limited impacts to the parks and park operations.
