Detention

Benton: 1 youth were held for 3 total of days of care, 0 females and 1 male.
Total Admissions to Detention = 1
Average Length of Stay = 3 days
Average Daily Population = 0.10 youth

Linn: 13 youth were held for 88 total of days of care, 4 females and 9 males.
Total Admissions to Detention = 13
Average Length of Stay = 6.77 days
Average Daily Population = 8.07 youth

Probation

The Juvenile Department received 46 referrals during the month of April 2019.

Of the 46 referrals, 0 represent dependency, 30 status and 16 criminal.

There are currently 255 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 67 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 97 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 31 youth.

Victim Advocate is serving 72 cases.

No work crews were facilitated during the month of April.

Miscellaneous Business -

The month of April had many employees working from home part of the week and working in the office the rest of the time. All face to face contacts were discontinued with probation officers, use of phone and other electronic devices is how PO's were checking in with youth.

Detention has been very restricted for youth coming into custody. All face to face visitations and volunteers entering the facility were suspended. Protocols were put into place to quarantine any new intakes for 72 hours to give the medical staff enough time to determine if an exposure had occurred. A retired teacher was hired on a part-time basis to provide educational instruction since the Gov. closed all schools. At the end of March 2020.

As the County enters Phase 1 of reopening the department is evaluating how it will begin seeing clients face to face safely. How we can re-engage with law enforcement to bring youth into detention who qualify based upon their charges or other factors.





MARCH 2020 Statistics







Note: Person, Property & Drug Crimes are at the ALLEGATION level.




