Subject: Frank Lumber Enterprise Zone Application and Action  
Resolution Waiving Employment Requirement

Frank Lumber is planning on making an investment in Mill City of \$9.8 million which includes building improvements and installing new equipment. The investment is to improve output and efficiency. They have completed an Enterprise Zone Authorization Application dated August 7, 2020.

Enterprise Zone regulations allow waiving the normal 10% employment increase for large investments when a company can demonstrate a 10% increase in productivity. Regulations recognize that large investments meant to increase output and efficiency do not always increase employment but is still desirable.

Attached is the draft resolution which need to be passed by each co-sponsor. The zone manager (me) and the county assessor's representative (Mark Wilkinson) cannot officially approve the company's application until the resolutions are approved by the co-sponsors.

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## Resolution and Order 2020-330

### An Intergovernmental Agreement for Transition Services between Greater Albany Public School District and Linn County

**\$123,326.00**

RO 2020-330 is an agreement between GAPS and the Juvenile Department for pass through dollars related to Title 1D funding which comes to GAPS because the Linn Benton Juvenile Detention Center and the Jackson Street Youth Services Albany Houses is located within the GAPS boundary. Money is allocated based on the number of youth who are placed in detention and shelter during a specific 30 day period. GAPS is the only school district in Oregon who passes all the Title 1 D funds back to the Juvenile Department to address high risk youth transitioning from detention back into their community school. Funds also support additional classroom assistance in the detention school, the horticulture program staff person. Additionally it pays for some transportation, tutoring and a summer educational program at the shelter.

There is \$19,298.00 being carried over from the past fiscal year and the new allocation amount is for \$103,398.00 to total the \$123,326.00
