Board Summaries for November 27, 2018

R&O 2018-365 - This is an Intergovernmental Agreement between Linn County and the Oregon Health Authority for the financing of Public Health services IGA# 154121 amendment 11. This is our monthly financial assistance award. We have received additional funding of \$80,037 for SPARC which is part of the Tobacco Prevention Education Program.

R&O 2018-366 - This is an Intergovernmental Agreement between Linn County and Our Lady of the Lake University for a Student Affiliation Agreement. This agreement is for an unpaid Mental Health Social worker Internship. Linn County will provide educational experience to students for their practicum-learning experience.

R&O 2018-374 - This is an agreement between Magellan HealthCare Inc. to provide payments for patients served by the department. This is basically an insurance contract between Magellan and Linn County Health Services to provide treatment.

R&O 2018-378 - This is agreement between Magellan HealthCare Inc. Amendment #1 which amends section 2, 3 and 5 of the original contract to comply with Oregon State Law for insurance companies that are headquartered outside of the State of Oregon.

R&O 2018-379 - This is an agreement between Trillium Community Health Plan and Linn County to provide services to Linn County residence who have Lane County Medicaid. It includes a new updated fee schedule that is effective January 1, 2019.

- Eligibility Transformation and Integrated Eligibility

Beginning in the fall of 2019, Oregonians will have two new ways to apply for multiple benefits at one time by using an online portal, visiting a local office, or calling an eligibility center. This streamlined access is made possible, via the following two projects that are currently underway.

Integrated Eligibility (IE) project that will implement a technology system for determining eligibility for multiple benefits such as Medicaid; SNAP; and *Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF)*, including Temporary Assistance for Domestic Violence, Employment Related Day Care (ERDC), Summer Meals, Refugee Cash, and Refugee Medicals, within one system.

Eligibility Transformation (ET) is a Department of Human Services organizational change project that will cross train staff who work on financial eligibility for Self Sufficiency Programs, Aging and People with Disabilities, and Area Agencies on Aging. The concept is that the network of staff who work in these programs will be able to serve any consumer in the State who walks into their office “storefront,” submits their application online, or calls requesting benefits.

Pilot projects will begin in Jackson and Josephine Counties, so State stakeholders can see how these projects will work for consumers of all abilities.

Transportation Services

- Albany Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO)
Following up on the adoption of AAMPO's first *Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)* this spring, the AAMPO Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) is working to address mobility targets for Highway 20 and Highway 99, taking into account performance measures set by Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). This analysis is based on the transportation impact associated with population and employment growth that is projected for the next 20 years, and assuming implementation of projects that are likely to be funded. Information related to the performance of these transportation corridors will help with future planning and project selection within the AAMPO area.
- Cascades West Area Commission on Transportation (CWACT)
On November 16th, CWACT presented its *Biannual Report* to the Oregon Transportation Commission (OTC). The OTC meeting was held in Lebanon with several CWACT Executive Committee members participating in the presentation and a roundtable lunch discussion on the future role of ACTs given funding changes from HB 2017.

Staff and Executive Committee Vice Chair Commissioner Annabelle Jaramillo also participated in the annual OTC Workshop in Silverton, which took place on October 18th.

CWACT convenes on transportation policy topics of regional significance, as an advisory body to the ODOT. Both recent meetings provided an opportunity for elected officials and other CWACT members to address transportation priorities and projects with OTC members and stakeholders Statewide.

- Cascades West RideLine (RideLine)
RideLine continues to provide high levels of non-emergent medical transportation assistance. In the period of July through September 2018, 3,915 *Ride Line* clients took a total of 51,555 trips. Most of these trips were sedan (31,077) trips or mileage reimbursements (12,698).

Most transportation services are for physical, mental, and dental health, with the single highest concentration of transportation services around alcohol and drug treatment, and mental health. A breakdown of trips made in Linn County is here:

In total, nearly 62,107 individuals are eligible for transportation assistance in OCWCOG's tri-county Region, including 34,390 in Linn County (2,587 Oregon Health Plan (OHP); 28,817 InterCommunity Health Network Coordinated Care Organization clients; plus, other Benton County residents on OHP with another Coordinated Care Organization total 3,425).

- Linn-Benton Loop (The Loop) Transit Service
The Albany and Corvallis Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) are working with the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and the Board of Directors of *The Loop* transit service regarding an analysis of the service. *The Loop* is operated by the City of Albany and provides a vital link between Albany, Corvallis, and surrounding communities. The service is heavily utilized by commuters for education and employment, and its routes and schedule need optimization to best serve the Region.

To date, the *Service Development Plan* held a kick-off meeting in September with a joint meeting of *The Loop* Board and TAC; an on-board ridership survey was conducted, with assistance from Oregon State University, through an upper division Sustainability Assessment class involving 34 students; and three Technical Memos have been drafted for the project team's review. The Technical Memos cover Existing Conditions, Needs Assessment, Evaluation Framework, and Funding Scan.

Keep Oregon Moving, Oregon's landmark transportation funding package passed by the Legislature last year, provides funding for intercity connections. The service analysis is expected to be completed this year and will enable *The Loop* to be competitive for these Statewide funds.

- *Measuring Multimodal Network Connectivity*
CAMPO and AAMPO are jointly working on the FHWA funded project Measuring Multimodal Network Connectivity. Broadly, the project examines how to prioritize bicycle and pedestrian improvements across the two MPO regions, based on a number of factors including existing infrastructure, population density, and employment centers. We have begun compiling data for the project in preparation for defining the study area. We will then begin assessing multimodal connections across the region.
- *Pedal Corvallis*
Pedal Corvallis, a community bikeshare program operated by OCWCOG in collaboration with several partners, added two new stations and nine new bikes on OSU campus in September. This addition brought the program to a total of ten stations, 50 bikes, and two adult trikes. *Pedal Corvallis* is available to anyone age 18 and older. As of October 9th, there are a total of 1,326 bikeshare members who have taken over 9,000 trips combined, since the program's June 2016 launch.
- *Regional Park and Ride Plan*
OCWCOG Planning Staff are in the process of developing a *Regional Park and Ride Plan*, and completed a public involvement survey in September that received over 550 responses from residents, visitors, and employees across the Region. The survey addressed commute options and utilization of park-and-ride facilities, including recommendations of locations for new *Regional Park and Ride* sites; suggested amenities for new and existing sites; and suggested selection criteria for future site development. A needs analysis is underway in partnership with ODOT evaluating travel data and demand forecasts. Resolution & Order 2018-369: In the Matter of Adopting a Policy for the Removal of Unlawful Campsites Located on Public Property



RE: **PD18-0149:** An appeal by Virgle Reynolds of the Linn County Planning Commission decision denying a conditional use permit for "Expanded Animal Husbandry" to breed and raise pigs on a 14.5-acre tract of land in the Rural Residential (RR-2.5) zone. The breeding operation would be limited to one (1) sow and one (1) boar producing one litter per year. Two (2) feeder pigs would be kept and raised and the remaining piglets would be sold once weaned. The property is located at 33514 Brewster Road, Lebanon (T12S, R02W, Section 01, Tax Lots 203, 4000, 4100, 4200, and 4300). The applicable decision criteria are contained in Linn County Code (LCC) 933.220(C).



I. INTRODUCTION

A. APPLICATION SUMMARY & BACKGROUND

The applicant, Virgle Reynolds, is proposing a pig breeding operation on a 14.5-acre tract in the Rural Residential (RR-2.5) zone. A pig breeding operation in the RR-2.5 zone is classified in Linn County Code as "Expanded Animal Husbandry" and requires a conditional use permit, pursuant to LCC 929.630(B)(7).

The breeding operation would consist of a total of one (1) sow and one (1) boar, producing one litter per year. Two (2) feeder pigs would be kept and raised and the remaining piglets would be sold once weaned. The pigs would be located in an enclosed field with a covered area. The application states the pigs are rotated through two pasture locations (summer & winter).

The application states that chores are carried out daily with no set time line. Vehicles proposed for the operation are personal vehicles to get to and from the pasture locations. The entire application and supplemental information is attached as **Exhibit D**.

On September 11, 2018, the Planning Commission (Commission) conducted a public hearing on the proposed "Expanded Animal Husbandry" conditional use application. After considering evidence and testimony submitted at the hearing, the Commission adopted a motion to deny the conditional use permit by a vote of 5-1.

On October 1, 2018, Virgle Reynolds, submitted a letter of appeal along with the required appeal fee. On October 16, 2018, the Department accepted the appeal letter and deemed it complete. The letter of appeal is attached as **Exhibit B**.

B. PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION

The Linn County Planning Commission (Commission) conducted a *de novo* public hearing on the conditional use permit application on September 11, 2018. After considering the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, the Commission, by a vote of 5-1, adopted a motion to deny the conditional use permit. Commissioners Alderman, Boshart, Legras, McKinney, and Stutzman voted in favor of the motion. Commissioner Egan was opposed. The Commission decision is attached as **Exhibit C**.

C. BOARD HEARING

A public hearing is scheduled before the Linn County Board of Commissioners (Board) on **Tuesday, November 27, 2018 at 10:00 a.m.** in Room 200 of the Linn County Courthouse in Albany Oregon. The public hearing on this matter is *de novo*. All evidence and argument must be submitted to the Board on the record to be considered in this matter. The Board will make a final land use decision after the close of the public hearing.

II. DECISION CRITERIA AND ANALYSIS

Linn County Land Development Code (LCC) 933.220(C) contains the applicable criteria for this decision.

LCC 933.200(C)

CRITERION: LCC 933.200(C)(1): The use will be consistent with the affected zoning district's statement of purpose.

FACTS: LCC 929.610 contains the Rural Residential zoning district statement of purpose:

929.610 Statement of purpose

(A) The purpose of the Rural Residential (RR) zoning district shall be:

- (1) to provide areas suitable for rural residential development thus preserving land of higher productivity for agricultural and forest resource use;
- (2) to provide for limited agricultural and forest uses where appropriate; and
- (3) to preserve and maintain the rural character of areas designated for such acreage home sites.

The subject tract is zoned Rural Residential Two and Half Acre Minimum (RR-2.5). In the RR-2.5 zoning district, the proposed pig breeding operation is classified under LCC 929.630(B)(7) as "expanded animal husbandry", and requires a conditional use permit.

929.630 RR uses permitted through a Type IIA conditional use review

(B) Uses permitted through conditional use review.

///

(7) Expanded animal husbandry including the raising, tending, pasturing or breeding of pigs or fur-bearing animals provided that such activities are not a part of, or conducted in conjunction with, any livestock sales yard, slaughter house or animal by-products business.

STAFF ANALYSIS: The subject tract is zoned Rural Residential Two and Half Acre Minimum (RR-2.5) and is located within a Rural Residential exception area (L-28, Brewster Road), adopted by Linn County on September 2, 1980. The Brewster Road exception area was recognized as a committed developed residential area. Surrounding lands to the north, east, and west are zoned Exclusive Farm Use and Heavy Industrial. Adjacent land to the south is located within the city limits of Lebanon. There are 10 dwellings within 250 feet of the subject tract.

The primary use of the subject tract is residential and limited farm use. Limited farm and forest uses are allowed uses in the Rural Residential zone. The applicants are currently conducting limited farm use on the subject tract.

The applicant is requesting a conditional use permit for expanded animal husbandry to allow for a pig breeding operation on the subject property. The proposed pig breeding operation is currently being conducted on the tract. The operation would be limited to a total of one (1) sow, one (1) boar, and a total of two feeder pigs from the one litter per

year with the remainder of piglets being sold. The pigs are located within an electric fenced pasture with a covered area. The applicant states that he has upgraded the electrical fencing as a best management practice to keep the pigs contained within the subject property, to reduce impacts to surrounding properties, to preserve, and maintain the rural character of area.

CRITERION: LCC Section 933.220(C)(2): The location, size, design and operating characteristics of the proposed development will be made reasonably compatible with and have minimal impact on the livability and appropriate development of abutting properties and the surrounding neighborhood, with consideration given to:

- (a) scale, bulk, coverage and density;**
- (b) availability of public facilities and utilities;**
- (c) traffic generation and the capacity of the surrounding road network; and**
- (d) other related impacts of the development.**

FACTS:

The operation is proposed to be conducted within an existing pasture and covered area on the subject property. No new development is proposed by the applicant at this time.

The tract has access via Brewster Road, and an easement on Eddings Lane. The applicant states that the operation will not generate any additional trips per day.

There is an existing sewage disposal system and well on the tract serving the dwelling located on tax lot 203. The property is served by the Linn County Sherriff's Department and the Lebanon Fire District.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The applicant is proposing a pig breeding operation. The operation would be limited to a total of one (1) sow, one (1) boar, and a total of two feeder pigs from the one litter per year, with the remainder of piglets being sold. The pigs are located within a pasture secured with an electric fence. The applicant states that he has upgraded the electrical fencing as a best management practice to keep the pigs contained within the subject property, to reduce impacts to surrounding properties. The tract has access off of Brewster Road. The applicant states that the operation will not generate any additional trips per day.

The subject property currently has a well upon tract of land. The applicant states that there will be no waste water generated through the pig breeding operation. There is an existing sewage disposal system located on the property identified as tax lot 203 on the map T12S, R02W, Section 01. Manure from the operation would remain within the pasture to be used as fertilizer. The applicant states that minimal water is required for the proposed use. The applicant proposes to use the well water upon the tract to fill the water trough.

There are 13 properties within 250 feet of the subject tract, ranging in size from 0.34 acres to 28.32 acres. Staff has received six (6) comments in opposition to the proposal. Adjacent residences range in distance from approximately 270 feet to approximately 900+ feet from the existing pasture area.

Comments were received from surrounding property owners regarding the proposal expressing concern with containment, odor, attracting of rodents, disposal of manure, water, damage to neighboring properties, and asserting that the scale of the proposed pig breeding operation is not consistent with the RR-2.5 zoning district (**Exhibit F**). The applicant should provide evidence or testimony to address concerns raised by surrounding property owners.

The property is currently located within the boundaries of the Lebanon Rural Fire District and is served by the Linn County Sherriff's Office. The Lebanon Rural Fire Department and the Linn County Sherriff's Office submitted comments expressing no concern regarding the proposed expanded animal husbandry operation (**Exhibit F**)

The Linn Country Road Department has evaluated the proposal and did not state any objections to the proposed expanded animal husbandry.

The Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA), Oregon Department of State Lands (DSL), and Oregon Water Resources Department (WRD) were notified of the proposed conditional use permit application. The ODA and the WRD did not submit comments as of the time this staff report was prepared. The DSL submitted comments regarding the proposed pig breeding operation that noted a state permit is required for 50 cubic yards or more of removal and/or fill in wetlands.

CRITERION: LCC Section 933.220(C)(3): The proposed development site has the physical characteristics needed to support the use such as, but not limited to the following:

- (a) access;**
- (b) suitability for on-site, subsurface sewage treatment system;**
- (c) an adequate supply of potable water;**
- (d) location outside of a mapped geologic hazard area or of a 100-year flood plain unless it is demonstrated that the use can be designed and engineered to comply with accepted hazard-mitigation requirements.**

FACTS:

The tract has access via Brewster Road. The applicant states that the operation will not generate any additional trips per day.

There is an existing sewage disposal system on the tract. The tract is served by an existing well. The tract is served by the Linn County Sherriff's Department and the Lebanon Fire District.

The tract is not located in a mapped geologic hazard area. A portion of the subject tract is located within the 100-year flood plain.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The tract has direct access onto Brewster Road, a county maintained road. The applicant states that the operation will not generate any additional trips per day.

The Linn County Road Department has evaluated the proposal and did not state any objections to the proposed expanded animal husbandry (**Exhibit E**)

Tax lots 4000, 4100, and 4200 contain the pasture where the pigs are currently being kept. There is no subsurface sewage treatment system upon these tax lots. The water for

the pig operation is obtained from a well which is located by the residence, on tax lot 203, and is transported through a watering hose.

The Oregon Water Resources Department (WRD) was provided notice and did not submit comments expressing any negative impacts as a result of the proposed expanded animal husbandry operation.

There are no mapped potential geologic hazards identified on the property (Bulletin 84, Environmental Geology of Western Linn County Oregon). A portion of the subject tract, tax lots 4000, 4100, and 4200, is located within an identified flood hazard area according to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance.

The Linn County Floodplain Manager has evaluated the proposal and did not state any objections to the proposed animal husbandry operation and did not identify any negative impacts to the floodplain as a result of the proposed use. Additionally, the Linn County Floodplain Manager did not identify any restrictions in the Linn County Floodplain Management Code that would prohibit the proposed expanded animal husbandry operation on the subject tract.

Comments were received from surrounding property owners regarding the proposal concerning water supply, and the location of the operation in relation to the floodplain and sensitive riparian habitat. There are no sensitive riparian habitats identified on the subject tract. Analysis addressing impacts to the 100-year floodplain are addressed above.

The applicant is not proposing any new buildings as part of the operation. Any future development on the subject tract is required to comply with Linn County Code Chapter 870 (Floodplain Management Code).

CRITERION: LCC Section 933.220(C)(4): The use will not have a significant adverse impact on sensitive fish or wildlife habitat.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The tract is not located within or near an identified sensitive fish habitat. The tract is not located within an inventoried wildlife habitat area.

IV. ZONING AND DEVELOPMENT BACKGROUND

The tract was zoned Agricultural Residential Timber (ART) on November 25, 1970, when zoning was first established in Linn County. The tract has been zoned Rural Residential (RR-2.5) since September 2, 1980. The tract is located within a Rural Residential exception area identified as L-28, Brewster Road.

A partition, a variance, and an access review were approved in 2006 to create the subject properties in their current configuration, and to establish a varied width 30-to-50 foot wide easement for access to tax lots 4000, 4100, 4200, and 4300 (PD06-0316).

V. PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS OF PROPERTY

- A. **TOPOGRAPHY** The subject tract is separated by a step historic bank. The land upon the bank is predominately flat land and is used for residential uses as it is located completely out of the flood plain. The land below the bank is predominantly flat land in the flood plain and is used for the raising, and breeding of pigs. The majority of the tract is covered in natural vegetation and trees. There is two areas designated wetlands that run from the south to the north-northwest corner of the subject tract.
- B. **NATURAL FEATURES AND IMPROVEMENTS** – There are no natural features of significance upon the property. Improvements on the properties include a single family dwelling and pump house.
- C. **NATURAL AND/OR GEOLOGIC HAZARDS** – There are no potential geologic hazards identified on the property (Bulletin 84, Environmental Geology of Western Linn County Oregon).

The subject tract contains significant amount of land within an identified flood hazard area according to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Study for Linn County, Oregon and Incorporated Areas dated September 29, 2010.

VI. ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS

- A. **WILDLIFE HABITAT** – The property is not located within an identified big game or sensitive wildlife or riparian habitat area.
- B. **WETLANDS** – The property contains wetlands in the form of a seasonal creek upon tax lots 4000, 4100, 4200, and 4300.

VII. AVAILABILITY OF PUBLIC FACILITIES AND SERVICES

- A. FIRE** - Fire protection is provided by the Lebanon Fire Protection District.
- B. POLICE** - The Linn County Sheriff's Department provides police protection.
- C. SCHOOL** - The property is within the Lebanon Public School District and the Linn-Benton Community College District.
- D. OTHER DISTRICTS** – The property is within the Linn Benton Lincoln ESD and 4-H Extension Districts.
- E. SEWAGE DISPOSAL** – There is an existing septic system located on tax lot 203 of the tract.
- F. WATER SUPPLY** – There is an existing residential well located on tax lot 203 of the tract. The pig breeding operation proposes to use this well for the pigs.
- G. ACCESS** – The tract, as it exists, has access off of Brewster Road.

VIII. RECOMMENDATIONS, CONDITIONS, AND REQUIREMENTS:

If the Board moves to deny the application, findings that demonstrate the reasons why the application does not comply with one or more of the applicable decision criteria in LCC Section 933.220(C) is required.

If the Board moves to approve the application, findings that demonstrate the reasons why the application complies with all of the applicable criteria in LCC Section 933.220(C) is required.

The Board may adopt reasonable and practical permit conditions and requirements that the Board finds are needed to make the proposed expanded animal husbandry conditional use permit compliant with any applicable decision criteria.

If the Board approves the application, staff recommends the decision include the following permit conditions. These conditions are presented as guidelines for Board discussion. The Board can choose to adopt, modify, or remove these conditions as part of its decision.

PROPOSED CONDITIONS:

1. A conditional use permit is approved for expanded animal husbandry for the breeding and raising of pigs. The breeding operation is limited to one (1) sow and one (1) boar producing one litter per year. No more than two (2) feeder pigs may be kept and raised; the remaining piglets must be removed from the property once weened.
2. The conditional use permit is issued to Virgle Reynolds only. The conditional use permit is not transferable to any other person or to another unit of land.
3. The applicant shall construct a fence along the pasture adequate to ensure containment of the pigs on the subject property.

4. Construction within an area of special flood hazard must comply with the Linn County Floodplain Management Code Chapter 870. For more information, please contact the Linn County Floodplain Administrator at 541-967-3816.

IX. NOTICE TABLE AND PROCEDURE

A. NOTICE

Property owners within 250 feet of the boundaries of the property were provided notice of this application. There are 13 property owners within the notification area. Six comments in opposition were received from surrounding property owners regarding the proposed application.

B. PROCEDURE

The Board of Commissioners will hold a public hearing on this matter on November 27, 2018 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 200 of the Linn County Courthouse in Albany, Oregon. The Board will review the application as a *de novo* hearing. The Board will conduct the hearing following the Uniform Hearing Procedures contained in Linn County Policy 34. The Board will make a decision after the close of the public hearing.

The Board may consider the application for 42 days from the close of the public hearing. Tabling of the request for a period not to exceed 35 days may also occur if the applicant consents. Specified findings, stating the reason for decision, are required in taking action on the proposal. The Board will consider all testimony and evidence presented in this matter and may take action to: (1) Approve the applications; (2) Deny the applications; or (3) Modify the applications.

All testimony and evidence must be directed toward the applicable decision criteria including applicable criteria in the plan or other land use regulations. Failure to raise an issue before the close of the record, or failure to provide statements or evidence sufficient to afford the decision maker(s) and the parties an adequate opportunity to respond to each issue raised precludes an appeal based on that issue.

If additional documents or evidence are provided by any party, the Board may allow a continuance or leave the record open to allow the parties a reasonable opportunity to respond. Prior to the conclusion of the initial evidentiary hearing, any participant may request an opportunity to present additional evidence or testimony regarding the application. The Board shall grant the request by either (a) continuing the public hearing or (b) leaving the record open for additional written evidence or testimony. If the Board grants a continuance, the hearing shall be continued to a date, time and place certain at least seven days from the initial hearing.


The Classification of Health Services Billing Specialist will be added to Appendix C as Classification #706 at Pay Range 8 during the next collective bargaining session.

This Agreement will be effective on the date it is signed by both the County and the Union.

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
