Detention

Benton: 8 youth were held for 41 total of days of care, 3 females and 5 males.

Probation

The Juvenile Department received 85 referrals during the month of September 2018.

Of the 85 referrals, 21 represent dependency, 34 status and 29 criminal.

There are currently 274 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 56 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 189 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation.

Victim Advocate is serving 61 .

Work Crew

Tier 1 – 4 youth completed 32 hours of community service in 1 project days. In 2017 we did not run Tier 1 crews in September.

Tier 2 – 39 youth completed 677.50 hours of work crew in 19 project days. In 2017, 29 youth completed 545.75 hours of service during the same time period.

Miscellaneous Business -

Hired a part-time person, Kate Hemlock, to oversee the New Beginnings Garden and native nursery project. Our detention school program is incorporating horticulture as part of our learning methods using these hands on opportunities for youth to learn skills not only related to horticulture but also math and writing. Kate has been the buyer for Garland Nursery for the last 14 years so comes with a wealth of knowledge and experience related to our project.





SEPTEMBER 2018 Statistics







Note: Person, Property & Drug Crimes are at the ALLEGATION level.





Resolution and Order 2018-238

Intergovernmental Agreement between Yamhill County and Linn County for the Rental of Juvenile Detention Beds

Yamhill County is responsible for all medical or other treatment services required for the youth beyond the normal day to day services offered at the detention center by Linn County or other contracted services.

Re: BOC Meeting Agenda Summary for 092 LINN CO (Kinney Ck.) Timber Sale Recommendation

-
- I am coming before the BOC to recommend that the Linn County Parks Department move ahead with the 092 LINN CO (Kinney Ck.) timber sale. Linn County Parks through our authorized Agent for the sale, Cascade Timber Consulting (CTC), has received four sealed bids for the stumpage sale (please see attached).
 - Freres Lumber Company has submitted the highest bid, which would provide Linn County with the greatest amount of gross revenue from the sale, estimated to be approximately 1.5 million dollars. The estimated total revenue is derived from CTC's timber volume estimates completed earlier this year. Once cut and delivered to the mill, all logs from the sale will be professionally scaled and all sale revenue will be based on the actual scaled timber volume at the bid prices. This is a "recovery sale" for stumpage, not a "lump sum" sale.
 - After completion of the sale Linn County Parks will be responsible for all required cleanup and reforestation costs, estimated to be \$50,000 to \$70,000.
