RE: Ordinance No. 2019-304, Ordinance No. 2019-305

Ordinance No. 2019-304: Amendments to the Outdoor Assembly Code to conform with the current State Law on mass gatherings, and house keeping amendments. These amendments will automatically sunset January 1, 2020 upon the effect of Ordinance No. 2019-305.

Financial Impact: NA

Staff Recommendation: DO PASS with emergency clause for September 3, 2019 effective date.

Ordinance No. 2019-305: Amendments to the Outdoor Assembly Code to implement the provisions of House Bill 2790 (2019)

Financial Impact: Allows an increase, pursuant to statutory authorization, of application fees from the current maximum of \$5,000 to a maximum of the greater of \$5,000 or \$2 per anticipated attendee.

Staff Recommendation: DO PASS with January 1, 2020 effective date.

The Road Department has the following items on the Board of Commissioners agenda for the weekly meeting on September 3, 2019. Below is a brief description of the items.

2019-263 – Delegate Authority to Purchase Two Dump Bodies

This is a Resolution & Order to authorize the purchase of, and delegate authority to, the Roadmaster for two dump truck bodies and associated equipment from Columbia Body Manufacturing. Total price is \$143,862.

2019-264 – Delegate Authority to Purchase Two Tandem Axle Cab & Chassis

This is a Resolution & Order to authorize the purchase of, and delegate authority to, the Roadmaster for two tandem axle dump truck cab & Chassis from McCoy Freightliner. Total price is \$261,776.

2019-283 – Acceptance of a Permanent Easement - Old Salem Road

This is a Resolution & Order to accept a permanent easement along Old Salem Road for construction of the sidewalk improvement project. Grantor is Applied Industrial Technologies, Inc. Easement cost is \$7,925.

2019-285 – Authorize Road Closure, North River Drive & Quartzville Road

This is a Resolution & Order to authorize the closure of portions of North River Drive and Quartzville Road for the Best in the West Triathlon and related events. Closure will be from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm on September 7 and 8, 2019.

Proclamation 2019-308

In the Matter of Proclaiming – September 9 – 13, 2019
As Veteran Suicide Prevention Week in Linn County

TO THE PEOPLE OF LINN COUNTY:

WHEREAS: The brave men and women of the United States Armed Forces, who proudly serve the United States and risk their lives to protect our freedom, deserve the investment of every possible resource to ensure their lasting physical, mental, and emotional well-being; and

WHEREAS: Linn County reaffirms our belief that mental health is an essential part of overall health, and together, we renew our commitment to supporting and empowering all Linn County veterans to seek the care they need; and

WHEREAS: Veterans often suffer from invisible wounds of war such as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, Military Sexual Trauma, and Traumatic Brain Injury, and left untreated, can manifest into serious depression, substance use disorders, and other life altering health issues. Tragically, these crises can sometimes involve thoughts of suicide — and we must do more to support those suffering; and

WHEREAS: All Citizens can take part in promoting mental well-being and preventing suicide by our nation's veterans, creating a culture where veterans are supported and safe to ask for help. We can do more to recognize the signs of mental health issues early and encourage those in need to reach out for support. And we must remind our loved ones that seeking treatment is not a sign of weakness; it is a sign of strength; and

WHEREAS: If you or someone you know needs help, the Veterans Crisis Line offers 24/7 immediate assistance at I-800-273-TALK (8255), veterans press 1.

WHEREAS: As we pause to raise awareness of the importance of suicide prevention, let us remember all those we have lost and the loved ones they left behind. We stand with all who have been greatly impacted by their service and who struggle to cope, and we continue our work to empower those facing these significant life challenges and hardship.

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY PROCLAIMED, That the week of September 9 - 13 as Veteran Suicide Prevention Awareness Week and encourage citizens, government agencies, organizations, health care providers, and research institutions to raise awareness of the mental health resources and support services available in their communities and encourage all those in need to seek the care and treatment for a long and healthy life.
