Community and Economic Development

Wetlands

Between the COVID-19 pandemic and Oregon Wildfires, the Cascades West Regional Consortium has only met once in the last 5 months. However, annual due's notices were distributed and members have been attending the 404 Assumption meetings held by the Department of State Lands. In addition, OCWCOG was recently approached by DSL to gauge interest in submitting a joint state/federal application for streamlined permitting. We expressed interest and hope to hear more on the topic this fall.

2020 Census Update

- Linn Co self-response rate as of 9/10 is 70.5%, which is above the 2010 rate of 68.3%
- Oregon's overall count rate is 96.3%. This includes self-response and counts by Census Bureau employees. The Census Bureau hasn't shared a breakdown of this data by county, so we can only assume Linn County's overall count is close to this.
- I'm sure the Census is the last thing on evacuee's minds, but the evacuated areas have some of the lower self-response rates in the County. If internet is provided at evacuation sites, encouraging folks to respond online while they're there could help improve the counts. Census data will likely be important for wildfire recovery funding.
- The 2020 Census work was set to end on September 30th, but a judge has ordered a reversal of that decision and a return to the October 31st end date.

Transportation Services

AAMPO

The Albany Area Metropolitan Planning Organization continues to meet remotely and conduct regular business. With a new staff person hired in August, the focus has been getting caught up to speed and preparing for a number of upcoming plans and projects. The region is embarking on their first Regional Active Transportation Plan, collaborating with Cherriots on a Salem to Albany transit feasibility study, and working with the City of Jefferson on their transportation system plan update. While Jefferson is in Marion County, they have close ties to the Albany/Millersburg area.

Probation

The Juvenile Department received 47 referrals during the month of August 2020.

Of the 47 referrals, 10 represent dependency, 17 status and 18 criminal.

There are currently 272 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 28 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 90 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 22 youth.







Note: Person, Property & Drug Crimes are at the ALLEGATION level.




